Statement of historical significance and description of property:

A110

This rural vernacular house has classical detailing. Its street-facing side (east) is symmetrical, with flat-roofed porch on tapered posts and half-columns with small capitals and no bases. Marks on the siding over the porch roof indicate where the upper porch railings were attached to the house. The windows and doors are narrow with architrave and top mouldings and plain side mouldings. The windows on the rectangular main portion of the house are double hung one over one. Those on the rear kitchen/bath wing are four over four double hung. The front door has a transom over and a large glass panel surrounded by colored glass panes.

There is no foundation and no basement. The house is finished in drop siding with plain corner mouldings. The medium high pitched gabled roof runs parallel to the street-facing side and the front face extends upward to form a wall gable at center front. Roof eaves are enclosed and overhang the fascia board by about 8". There is a central chimney in the 2-story front section; rear section has its own chimney.

The front entry hall has stairs to second story and flanking side rooms with 12' ceilings. A living room with fireplace is straight through entry hall.

Alice Daniel, daughter of the owner of the Star Mill, moved into the house in 1900 and still resides there.
