Statement of historical significance and description of property:

A301

This is a large, squat, one-and-one-half story bungalow of wood frame construction. There is considerable ornamentation, dominated by the broad front porch with four stout, square pillars, with elaborate "double-cross" capitals and mounted on tall brick piers. The medium-pitched hipped roof has a deeply overhanging cornice with exposed rafter ends, and detached stick-like brackets. The hipped roofed dormers on the south (front), east, and west sides reflect this arrangement. The rear (northern) elevation is a tall gable with broad verge board. Windows are irregularly distributed, and are mainly of the sash type. This is quite a well-preserved example of bungaloid architecture, which with its two neighbors to the west (169 and 251 Park Avenue) makes up an interesting triptych p, possibly by the same architect.
