Statement of historical significance and description of property:

## A354

This two and one-half story box house has a low-pitched bell cast hipped roof with exposed rafters.

The basement is of blocks. The windows are regular double hung sash with cornice moulding. Beveled siding with corner boards. Dormers on three sides are hip-roofed. An outside chimney is on the south side, as is a rectangular bay protected by a shed roof. A full width raised porch has a low-hipped roof, supported by square posts connected by a balustrade. The entrance is off-center.

The house was built by Emily Hedden Hamblen, widow of Clark Hamblin who established Hamblin Wheeler Clothiers in McMinnville. It was in later years occupied by Dr. Ward Wisecarver, a dentist and son of an early pioneer.
