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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

A459 – Demolished

Large Italianate two-story house. Wide horizontal siding wrap around porch (front and east side) supported by round Tuscan columns; ornate balustrades. Eaves supported by ornately carved paired brackets separated by decorated frieze porch. Fenestration regular, one-overone. Tall narrow windows have triangular pediment of cornice mold. Front door has large etched glass window. One tall exterior chimney on west side. Very old, large plantings. Wooden foundation. Large single story addition at rear of house. Extra large lot. This house was built for John Wiesner, long time McMinnville cigar manufacturer. His cigar store stood on the corner of Evans and Third and was a social center of sorts.
