Statement of historical significance and description of property:

#### A839

This two-story olive brown with white trim wood frame structure can only be described by us as eclectic. It has features of Italianate and classical revival construction. There is much to describe so we shall just pick out some features and offer some comments. It has a low brick foundation with a beveled wooden water table. It features novelty siding and, basically, one-over-one, double-hung sash windows. From here, it "takes off" with varying roof levels and notable features.

The formal entranceway appears to be on the north side and has a classic (Greek) revival-type entranceway which has a small covered porch with four simple columns. The entranceway appears to extend for two stories with a gabled roof tucked under the larger gabled roof of the house.

There is a two-story bay on the west side of the house. It has corners with rusticated quoins and shows up rather well in the accompanying picture. There is so much to describe that we have rather let it go with this. Under the gabled roofline is frieze board and brackets with organically scrolled motif support cornices under the straight gabled roofline. Rafters are not exposed. Additions appear to have been made in the form of an enclosed stairway on the south side, a porch, and steps on the east side.

The grounds are not well kept, and the house appears to have been painted recently. Sarah Newby sold this property to Phoebe and W.W. Wright in 1885 for \$800, indicating that the house stood at that time.
