Statement of historical significance and description of property:

A868

Corner lot. Large square box shape with two stories and dormers on three sides of hipped roof. The roof is shingles with asphalt. The house had drop siding, boxed cornices with frieze. The porch with stone piers and square pillars is wrapped around the front and left side of the house. It has a wood floor, ornamental wood railing, and cement steps. The windows are large and square, some with a narrow row of panes across the top, some double-hung. There is a flat roof extension in the back and a bay over the basement entrance on the side. A covered ramp leads to the basement on street side (a later addition). The house exhibits some colonial revival elements and some oriental influence (the flared roof and porch lattice, specifically).

The house was built in 1909 by early Yamhill County druggist, Archibald M. Peery. His grandson is still a McMinnville pharmacist. It was acquired shortly after it was built by William T. Macy, proprietor of a furniture and undertake firm. His grandson has a local funeral home today. The Macy's lived in the home for many years
