Statement of historical significance and description of property:

#### B109

This 2 story house was built by using 2 x 12's for vertical exterior walls. No studding as in the newer houses. The house faces south with a shed dormer, having 3 double hung sash windows 1/1. Other windows are 6/6 double hung sash and the front door is in the center with lights. The later bungalow dormer has four boxed pillars. A single outside chimney was originally in the center of t house. Drop siding was used with corner boards. The original exterior color was a dark red with yellow trim around the windows. There is no foundation. The house is supported on wood placed on large boulders. It has a high gable roof with plain projecting verges. We have dated this house in the 1860's from newspapers taken from the walls. The main part of the house was 4 room downd and 4 rooms up. With changes and additions of the kitchen built in 1882 and the bathroom in 1911, there are 6 rooms down and 2 up. The kitchen was dated again by newspapers and the bath by a signature board signed by the builder, W.J. Kelley. The dormer is a later addition.

John Sax came to Oregon in 1852. Originally from Switzerland, he and his brother settled in Oregon. At first he ran a dray for several years with a firm in Portland. Then moving to Washington County and on to McMinnville and invested in the Brick Mill 1868 (a flour mill on the west side of the cosine).

The home is currently undergoing another remodel.
