Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B296

This is a one-and-one-half story dwelling of wood frame construction with concrete foundation, exhibiting features of the bungalow style. The house is irregularly shaped with an enclosed porch in the northeast corner and a smaller cross-gable on the southwest side of the façade. The house faces south, with an open, cutaway L-shaped porch along portions of the south and east sides. Fenestration is fairly regular, and there is considerable ornamentation, including deep eaves with heavy brackets and broad vergeboards with unusual decorative ends. Of particular note is a slightly oriental appearance due largely to the inset, four pillared dormer. The house is in very good condition and is largely unaltered. There are two large oak trees on the southern edge of the property.
