Statement of historical significance and description of property:

#### B343

This is a rectangular two and one-half story Dutch colonial style with an asphalt shingle gambrel roof with a bell-like flare that returns at the first floor. It has horizontal siding, outside south end brick chimney, and brick foundation. The main entrance is centrally positioned with a six panel entry door with plain sidelights. The entrance is covered by a projecting plain pedimented porch with Tuscan columns.

Upper floor windows are shuttered and double-hug with eight over one light on the ground story; six over one light on the second story. The east side of the house has a second story enclosed rectangular glass porch over the carport which is supported by rectangular columns. A Tuscan two-columned carport projects from the north side of the house.

The house was regarded as one of McMinnville's finest residence when it was built in 1924 by Elijah Corbett. The house was sold in 1934 to Glenn S. and Gladys Macy on March 6, 1934. The house remained in the Macy family until 1983.
