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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B350

This impressive 20th Century English Tudor style dwelling has gothic elements incorporated into its architecture. The basic shape is an imperfect L; there are two and one-half stories.

The predominate roof style is high bellcast hip with a bellcast hip roof on the eastern extension, and, a bellcast hip enclosed porch on the south entrance. The roof is shingle. There are three interior brick chimneys; the south chimney is corbelled with diamond decorative patterns. The first story has stucco walls; the second story has shingle siding. The foundation is cement.

There are three gable dormers with overhang on the east, west, and north sides; the east gable has curvilinear bargeboards as well as a gothic sash window. There are also two gothic sash windows on the south half story below exposed beam work and English stick style decoration. There are symmetrically placed gothic sash windows on either side of the entrance on the south porch. There is a hip roof porch covering the east entrance. The south side of the first story has a five paneled bay window with three lights over fifteen in each panel. The east side of the first story has a three panel bay window with fifteen, twenty, and fifteen lights respectively. The east side entrance door has twenty lights and there are one half sidelights. There is a two car attached garage with segmental arches on the south side.

There is a cement inscription on 9th and Cowls which reads: 1911 J.H. Price. Prior to the street renaming, this was the corner of Cedar and C Street. The landscaping is exceptional and considering the ten foot high hedges is likely original. The house stands alone in this neighborhood as an outstanding example of its genre.

The house was built in 1929 by local physician, Dr. W.H. Barendrick. The architect's name was Combs. The house was sold to hardware store owner, L.A. Courtemanche in 1943-4.
