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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

#### B388 – Demolished 2006

Small, one and one-half story rectangular wood frame structure with Gambrel roof and one-story shed roof extension in rear (asphalt shingles on both) situated towards front and side street of corner lot.

Front façade is asymmetrical with hip roof, forming cover for full front porch, supported by simple wooden columns. Front door has shelf or entablature.

Each side of home has small gable dormers with patterned shingles on front façade of gable.

Structure has at least partial concrete foundation with vertical siding from wooden water table area to ground. Center chimney has broken crown.

The home was built by a member of the locally-prominent Sitton family, and Yamhill County Sheriff (1900-1904) Ward Sitton and his wife Stella lived in the home briefly around 1908.

County Sheriff (1900-1904) Ward Sitton and his wife, Stella, bought the property in 1905 from Rosealtha Eccleston for \$1,660. She had purchased it the year before for \$250.
