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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

## B489

This building faces south midblock on Third Street between Davis and Evans Streets. The parapet wall of the façade is of buff-colored brick, has a straight, corbelled roofline and restrained ornament of raised brick panels and diamonds. Tiers of raised brick articulate either side of the façade. Three openings across the façade have been blocked or stuccoed over. The ground floor storefront has one central opening, flanked by large aluminum framed windows. An awning stretches the full width of the façade. The rear elevation which faces an alley is slightly gable, is of concrete, and has openings.

The building was once a theater. The ceiling has been lowered for commercial use.
