Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B492

This large two story funeral home is of classic revival style with four round Doric columns supporting a pediment. There is a large central pavilion with two smaller wings. Shape is generally rectangular. Construction is of brick with an asphalt shingle roof. Fenestration is regular. Second story windows are double hung sash, six-over-six. Ground floor windows are tall rectangular casements with 15 lights. Windows in central pavilion are in groups of two. Main entrance doorway has two side lights with four lights each. Doorway has engaged columns and is topped with a pediment. There are two chimneys, one centrally located with corbelled cap. Roof is hipped. The Macy family was in the furniture and undertaking business in McMinnville's early days. The business was at one time on Third Street.
