Statement of historical significance and description of property:

#### B553 – Tree fell down/removed 2008

Samuel and Mahala Cozine's original log cabin stood on the site of Pioneer Hall, just southeast of this tree. "Mr. Cozine, ...known throughout the county as "Uncle Sam", put up his blacksmith shop near the tree on the college campus which is now name for one of the sororities, the "Edelweiss Oak". There, ashes and cinders and an occasional scrap of iron from his forge can still be found." (Mahala Cozine Obituary, <u>Telephone Register</u>, April 24, 1908)

The Cozine's donated the land that Linfield College now occupies. It was the eastern portion of their Donation Land Claim.
