Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B747 – Demolished 1989

This is a square two-story structure located in the center of the lot. Moderately gabled roof, moderately steep shed roofed porch. The exterior façade consists of medium width tongue-in-groove wood siding. Fenestration is symmetrical, upper story windows are double-hung sash, one-over-one, with plain sills. First story windows are double-hung sash, one-over-one, with plain cornice and sills. The foundation is brick and there is an interior side chimney. The porch has simple wooden columns, with simple bases and capitals. Sawn wood brackets connected to a plain frieze board support the porch. There are also sawn wood supports parallel with the porch as the top. The original main door has two small lights off-setting two larger interior lights. This pattern is repeated twice. Below the lights are two small inset wood panels.
