Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B761

This two story square shaped home is situated on a corner lot with a huge redwood tree on the northeast corner, which was planted before the house was built. The exterior is green stucco with brick. The roof is a red tile cross gable with a shed roof west side rear. The foundation is brick and cement. A bulkhead cellar entrance on the north leads to a full basement. The window treatment is varied, single pane casements, 18 pan windows with shutters, 24 pane casements, and double hung sash all with shelf trim. A cement and brick walkway extends through a six pillared arbor, covered with a corrugated metal roof, to a glass enclosed front porch with an off center main entrance. There are two brick chimneys, one on the front end and one centered to the rear. A projecting bay is on the north. A double car garage with hipped gable roof is on the northeast side. A mossy stone wall surrounds the well landscaped yard.

Walter Link was a cashier for the McMinnville National Bank in 1912.
