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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B852

Corner location, built in 1941. Medium sized sanctuary and classroom building with a horizontal sided wood social hall attached in the rear. Asphalt shakes on roof, cement foundation, multi-lighted windows on each side. Front aspect of church has three sets of narrow windows with plain leaded glass lights. Front entry is reached by a long curved ramp with wrought iron railings which leads to a flat square tower. Small octagonal windows flank each side of an arched recessed entry which ahs double arched doors with small panes in the panels. Windows in wooden part are double hung with small lights above and below. There are no overhangs or eaves, the gutters are flush against the roof line with a frieze decoration underneath. The building has somewhat of a Williamsburg appearance.

The Methodist-Episcopal Church was occupying this site as early as 1871. This building is the third church building to sit on the property. The second was built in the 1890's when the original 1871 building was razed.
