Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B855 State Special Assessment Program

This three story block-shaped brick building faces south on the corner of 3rd and Ford Streets. The brick is covered, on the façade, above the ground floor by rough stucco. At the east elevation, the parapet wall, cornice ornament and piers of cut brickwork are all exposed. Fenestration is irregular; one over one double hung sash windows are paired under multi-lighted arched transoms; several toward the rear of the east elevation are flat-arched. On the façade, the two arches are flanked by narrower double hung sash windows. The parapet on the façade is interrupted by a false gable. The ground floor has two storefronts with large windows. All windows are set with deep reveals. The building has a full cement basement where structural timbers approximately 10 inches square are visible. A basement-to-street freight elevator is still in operation. The rear elevation is gray cement with irregular fenestration.

The building was erected by the International Order of Odd fellows who still own it, in 1909. It replaced an earlier IOOF Hall of the same site built in 1887. The cornerstone holds coins, souvenirs, personal cards, bank and school data and list of IOOF and Rebekah officers. The cornerstone was inscribed: "Occidental Lodge No. 30, IOOF, June 26, 1909."
