Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B964

The present renters volunteered the date of 1887 as that of erection of this home. A basic T-shape, the 2 story west section was the original home (?) with the east extension added later. The west section has gabled roof with composition shingles. Four 1/1 windows in balanced alignment are on the north and 2 1/1 windows on either side of a front entrance porch on the west. A gabled hood with wood support beams roofs this porch. Weather board or novelty siding covers the home. A rear entrance is at the east addition and fenestration on this addition is irregular. Wood covers the foundation of perhaps brick supports. A large old oak graces the front lawn to complement the age of the house. A Mr. and Mrs. Wolf were original owners and builders and ran a chicken ranch in the yard.
