- Stated purpose was for a technical reference point to prioritize capital improvements and maintenance requirements

► 2021 <u>Concept</u> Planning

Community Advisory Committee (MACPAC) recommends:

- New Rec Center: 2 preferred locations, operational, programming and design concepts. 125,000 sq'@\$111 million
- Senior Center improvements: \$3.55 million
- New Library at location of existing Aquatic Center: 29,756
 sq'@\$25.38 million

Poll Assumptions \$152.5 million

 - Parks = \$9 million/5 years or \$24/20 years
