SUBJECT: Public Hearing on FY2022-23 Approved Urban Renewal District Budget



CITY GOVERNMENT CAPACITY

Strengthen the City's ability to prioritize & deliver municipal services with discipline and focus.

Report in Brief: A public hearing on the FY2022-23 Urban Renewal Budget as approved by the Budget Committee is required by Oregon statute.

Discussion of Hearing and Resolution Actions:

On May 17, 2022, the McMinnville Urban Renewal District's (UR) Budget Committee approved the City of McMinnville 2022–2023 Budget. ORS 294.453 requires that, after the local government's budget committee has approved the budget, the governing body must hold a budget hearing to take citizen testimony on the approved budget.

Five to 30 days before the scheduled hearing, ORS 294.448 requires that the governing body publish a "Notice of Budget Hearing and Financial Summary." The Notice includes the date, time, location and remote access instructions for the budget hearing and a summary of the 2022 – 2023 Approved Budget. The Notice must appear in a newspaper of general circulation.

The required Notice and Financial Summary were published in the News Register on May 31, 2022.

The City also has a Budget Public Comment page on its website to facilitate the community's ability to weigh in on budget matters in a remote way.

A resolution adopting the FY2022-23 Urban Renewal District Budget will be presented to the City Council at the June 28, 2022 meeting. The City will then certify the budget to the County Assessor's office prior to July 15, 2022.

Fiscal Impact:

Following the budget adoption and public hearing process is required for the Urban Renewal District to draw property taxes as allowed above the District's frozen base.

Recommendation: Hold public hearing as required by ORS 294.453.

STATEMENT OF CHANGES IN ACTIVITIES and SOURCES OF FINANCING *

This is the Urban Renewal (UR) District's ninth year and revenues are beginning to grow based on investments made in the district. For 2022-23, the total incremental increase in assessed value is anticipated to be \$43.1 million over the District's 2012-13 "frozen" base value of \$86.3 million. Property taxes are projected to increase to \$598,000. Projects for 2022-23 include Third Street Improvements (\$85,000) and the Property Assistance Program (\$100,000) to incentivize new construction and building improvements in the District. Capital investments in public offsetreet parking and district identiy improvements are also included. Debt Service of \$187,288 (included in Interfund Transfers) is appropriated for payment on 2016-17 Alpine Avenue loan.
